5. Demonstrated commitment to putting the student experience first.

6. Demonstrated use of current technologies to support student learning and the management of grades.
7. Proven track record of life-long learning.
8. Demonstrated ability to work effectively with a variety of internal and external stakeholders including students, faculty, support staff, administrators and community stakeholders.

10. Ability to apply and communicate new concepts and creative strategies for the ongoing development of innovative health care technology management practices.
